CASTLE ROUTE

The icons, beautifully connected.

A confident first walk through Old Town, with beautiful details and time to pause.

3-4 HOURS

MOSTLY FLAT

BEST: MORNING



SCAN ROUTE

YOUR WALK

1

Powder Tower & Municipal House

Begin close to the hotel with two contrasting Prague landmarks.

2

Old Town Square

Take in Týn Church, the square and the Astronomical Clock.

3

Clementinum

Pass through the historic complex on the way toward the river.

4

Charles Bridge

Cross slowly; the views are part of the experience.

5

Kampa

Finish by the water, then continue into Malá Strana or return by tram.

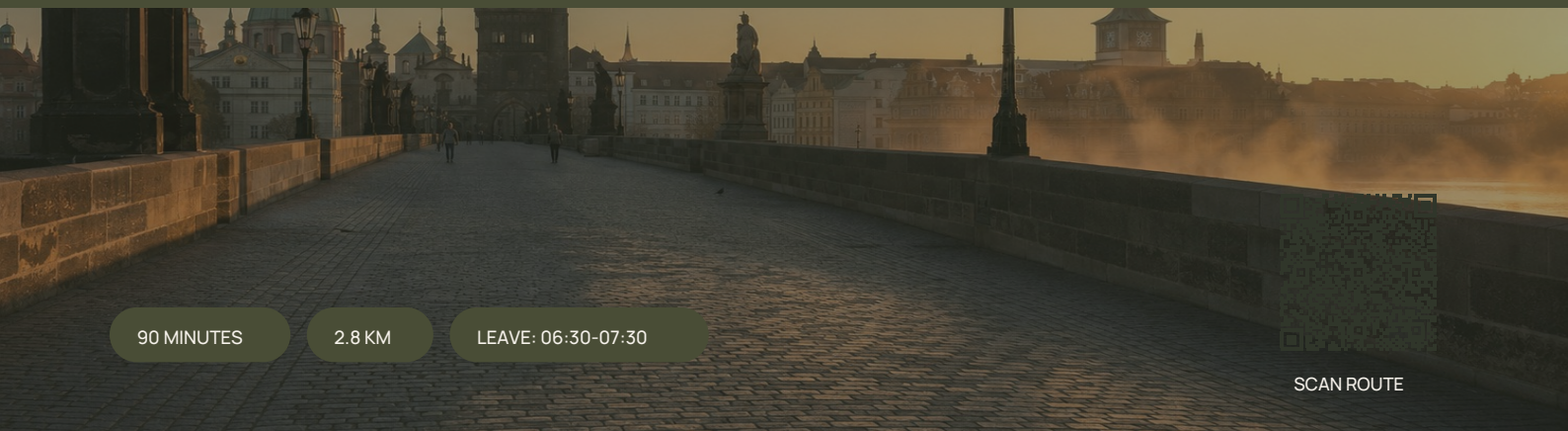
LOCAL NOTE

For a calmer bridge, leave before 08:00 or return after dinner, when Prague settles down.

OPEN WALKING ROUTE

Before the city wakes.

A quieter morning route through the historic centre, before the streets fill.



YOUR WALK

- 1** Old Town Square
See the square before the day-trippers arrive.
- 2** Karlova lanes
Follow the old route toward the river while the shops are still closed.
- 3** Charles Bridge
Pause halfway for views in both directions.
- 4** Kampa Island
End with a riverside stroll and choose a breakfast stop on the way back.

LOCAL NOTE

Check sunrise time the evening before. In winter, a later start can still mean beautifully quiet streets.

OPEN WALKING ROUTE

Across the river, above the rooftops.

Cross Charles Bridge and let the city open into courtyards, gardens and views.

4-5 HOURS

SOME HILLS

BEST: EARLY

SCAN ROUTE

YOUR WALK

1

Malostranské náměstí

Cross the river and begin below St Nicholas Church.

2

Prague Castle

Explore the courtyards and choose the interiors that matter most to you.

3

Nerudova Street

Descend past historic house signs and Baroque façades.

4

Lennon Wall

A colourful pause before the riverside.

5

Kampa Island

Finish with trees, water views and an easy tram connection back.

LOCAL NOTE

Castle security and ticket queues can take time. Start early and leave room for an interior visit.

OPEN WALKING ROUTE

Take the quieter turn.

A slower walk through courtyards, gardens and streets that reward curiosity.

2-3 HOURS

LOCAL PACE

BEST: LATE MORNING

SCAN ROUTE

1

Týn Courtyard - Ungelt

A layered historic courtyard just behind the main square.

2

Haštalské lanes

Let the smaller streets lead you toward the northern Old Town.

3

Convent of St Agnes

A peaceful Gothic complex and garden setting.

4

Dvořák Embankment

Open river views after the enclosed medieval streets.

5

Jewish Quarter

Return through Josefov and the elegant streets around the synagogues.

LOCAL NOTE

Slow down here. Keep ten free minutes for the courtyard or passage you did not plan to enter.

OPEN WALKING ROUTE

Prague, a little more local.

Places we like when you want to step beyond the postcard version of the city. Tap any card to open the map.

VERY CLOSE TO THE HOTEL

St Agnes Convent Gardens

Quiet gardens, Gothic walls and contemporary Czech sculpture.

MAP >

HRADČANY

Nový Svět

Tiny historic houses and winding lanes behind the Castle. Lovely in the late afternoon when the main sights start to empty.

OPEN MAP >

ŽIŽKOV

Vítkov Hill

A broad city panorama, wooded paths and the monumental National Memorial - a very different Prague skyline.

OPEN MAP >

VINOHRADY

Grébovka

Vineyard, grotto and an Italian-inspired park. A relaxed choice for a slow afternoon or a picnic.

VINOHRADY

Jiřího z Poděbrad

Plečnik's striking church, neighbourhood cafés and a market-square rhythm that feels distinctly residential.

Karlín

Café gardens, converted industrial architecture and easy access to the green slopes below Vítkov.

HOLEŠOVICE

DOX & the art district

Former factories, contemporary art and Czech design. A good change of pace - and an easy option on a grey day.

THE BENEDICT LOCAL NOTE

One neighbourhood is often more memorable than five landmarks. Pick one area, slow down and leave room for a café, a park bench or a street you did not plan to find.

Walk Prague from our front door.

Follow our suggested city loop or use the illustrated landmarks to create your own walk from Rybná 16.

CURRENT FARES

VALIDATE ONCE

Stamp a paper ticket before entering the metro platform or immediately after boarding a tram or bus.

ONE PERSON, ONE TICKET

Prague does not use one shared group ticket. Each traveller needs a valid ticket.

CHILDREN

Children under 15 travel free in Prague; ages 10-15 should carry proof of age.

WALK + TRAM

For most guests, walking through Old Town and taking a tram for the longer return is the easiest combination.
